

Word Study: Unit 27
spelling – prefixes *re* and *un*
vocabulary – eating out

This week we will be studying words made up of a base words and a prefix. A prefix is a word part added to the beginning of a base word. It adds meaning to the base word. The prefix *re-* means “again.” The prefix *un-* can mean “not” or “opposite of.”

un + fair = **unfair**

un + fold = **unfold**

re + play = **replay**
